WSC Responds to Alleged Sewage Run-Off at Arawak Cay Fish Fry

New Providence, The Bahamas: The Water and Sewerage Corporation (WSC) wishes to clarify claims in an article in today’s Nassau Guardian Business section titled, “ACVA president: Sewage runoff into Fish Fry will be dealt with after general election.”

The corporation notes the claims made by the Arawak Cay Conch, Fish, Vegetable and Food Vendors Association President Lillian Laramore-Smith in the article but also wishes to explain that there are no ongoing sewerage leaks at Arawak Cay.

WSC has completed several upgrades in the area, the last of which was done in October 2025, over a five-day period. Some of the work included repairing a 10-inch sewer main which had collapsed. Pumping was done around the clock, at the time, and once completed, operations returned to normal.

As with any and all installations, the corporation is responsive to any complaints and emergencies it receives in a timely fashion.
